Sports Funding at Peasedown St John Primary School

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum during the academic years 2013 - 2014 and 2014 - 2015 to improve the provision of PE and Sport in primary schools. This funding is awarded to every primary school; the funding for Peasedown St John Primary school is approx. £9500.

To ensure that we are spending the funding in the most appropriate way we have used the Ofsted Report 'Beyond 2012 - outstanding physical education for all' and the Association of Physical Education "Evidencing and Impact" tool to support us.

Principles

- A. To hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside our teachers when teaching PE to increase their professional knowledge, skills and confidence when teaching sport
- B. To improve the quality and quantity of resources for PE/sport in our school
- C. To increase the provision of places and clubs for pupils outside school hours
- D. To increase the professional development opportunities in PE/sport for all our teachers which might include providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- E. Increased access and participation in sport, competitions and in school games, particularly within the Cluster group of local schools

Provision 2013-14

- A.
 - Sports Coaching from specialised coaches within school
 - 6 week programme block each half term for Newly Qualified Teachers
- B.
 - Equipment and Resources - including improved storage facilities
 - Support school in purchasing additional equipment
 - Coaches/staff funded to attend sporting competitions and events
 - Increased hall space for PE in liaison with Youth Centre
 - Investigate potential for employing additional Sports Specialist Teaching Assistant
- C.
 - Sports Coaching out of School
 - Additional clubs with a particular emphasis on tournaments, leagues and competition within the cluster
 - Subsidised Breakfast Activity clubs - fun, active, healthy
- D.
 - Professional development for Staff - during staff meetings
- E.
 - Support our School and the Cluster in developing and enhancing sport - liaison with Headteacher and PE Leader and others in the cluster
 - PE leader to be head of Sports Cluster to organise events
 - Additional swimming lessons for Year 6 children who cannot swim the required 25m
 - Involve a wider range of staff to lead each festival/tournament and preceding practises - release will be required.
